on unexpected absentees. Parents and carers can use the MYEd app to communicate with school for known absences prior to the lesson.

Live lessons continue to be popular amongst students, each lesson is recorded and visible on office 365. We may be able to provide additional lessons for some year groups. Please check Show My Homework for the live lesson schedule.

Each department will continue to use Show My Homework to set home learning, this may include some formal assessments towards the end of this term as well as giving the students notice of when live lessons are taking place.


