#### Live online lessons

Each department will continue to use Show My Homework to set home learning, this may include some formal assessments towards the end of this term as well as giving the students notice of when live lessons are taking place.

School remains closed to all other students in Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9. Remote learning continues to be the main delivery method until the end of the summer term. Parents and carers are welcome to sit with students when live lessons are streamed. We do ask, however, that they do not join via their own private email account, as this is visible to all attendees

#### Get out, get active - a city-wide race around the world

On Sunday 05 July between 9am & 6pm, many schools across Sheffield will take part in a fun event that is asking for our students, and willing parents and carers to walk, run or cycle a distance of at least 5km. It is hoped that the combined effort of our community will complete a distance of 495km. This is the distance from Lusaka in Zambia to Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe. The school that covers the distance first will be crowned, albeit virtually, the winner. The school that covers the greatest distance by 6pm will win second place. The All Saints PE Department will also award a prize to the student, parent, carer or member of staff who covers the greatest distance in that time too.
