Welcome to this week's newsletter. We hope that you are all keeping well.


Lessons taking place in school:

Get out, get active - a city-wide race around the world

On behalf of the school, the PE wanted to thank everyone who managed to get up, get out and get active. Nearly two hundred people from our school community took part in this citywide event, many sharing images of their achievements. It was a phenomenal effort, which ended up with us finishing third in the city, only just pipped by Westfield who finished second. Altogether our community covered 1768 Km. Below are a few more amazing figures:

Sheffield schools combined total: 12500km (more than the distance from Sheffield to Victoria, Zimbabwe) All Saints community:

- 116 pupil entries, the greatest distance covered by a student was 40.59km
- 36 parent entries, the greatest distance covered by a parent/ carer was 39.45Km.
- 38 staff member entries, greatest distance covered by a member of staff was 39.21km
