Remote Learning Strategy Information for Parents and Carers

Revised: Nov 2020



Rationale

As educators we will strive to provide a variety of learning experiences for students while they are learning at home.

We are mindful that home learning is different and there are many factors to be considered. We encourage all students to take breaks from screen time and engage in other worthwhile activities such as reading and exercise.

Extension and challenge work can be requested from subject teachers and many have already uploaded material in the Year Group Teams area.

Although every effort will be taken to provide work, we do understand that circumstances at home such as reduced IT availability might mean that students complete work at different times and may need additional support. Please find our Year Leaders contact details on Page 11.



Remote Learning

We are confident that the Covid secure measures put in place have ensured that all students and staff have had a safe and comfortable return to school in September.

However, we do have contingency plans in place for circumstances where staff or students have to access online lessons.

We will communicate with parents through MyEd (Text Message Service)



Protocol Reminders for Students

When using **TEAMS**:

- All live lessons will be through TEAMS
- Teachers will inform the class if the lesson is going to be recorded
- KS3 & KS4 Student cameras should be turned off if accessing from home (Drama and Music may require short periods of interaction using cameras)
- Staff cameras are optional if delivering from home
- KS3 & KS4 Student microphones should be switched off unless directed by the teacher and students should make use of the chat function to ask the teacher questions



If a staff member is not ill but isolating - 6th Form

- Sixth Form: Work will be set by the Class Teacher and placed in the Class Teams Area. A message for students will be left on the post board of the Class Team.
- A minimum expectation would be to ensure that resources for every timetabled lesson are on Teams in advance and the teacher is available online during that period for Q and A.
- Some Teachers will deliver a live lesson for at least part of the time. Students will be notified on Teams.
- Any students not in school for lessons will need to notify attendance.



If a staff member is not ill but isolating - KS3 and KS4

- Work will be set by the Class Teacher for a Cover Supervisor to deliver and the Teacher will be available online for part of the lesson for clarification and questions by the cover supervisor.
- If some students are also at home they will be invited to join the lesson during 'live' and/or work will be set on Teams/SMHW

• Many Teachers are able to deliver a live lesson for at least part of the time. Students in class may be asked by the cover supervisor to log in to Teams to allow Teacher to join the lesson.



If a staff member is in school but students in the class are isolating - 6th Form

- Sixth Form: Work will be set by the Class Teacher and placed in the Class Teams Area. A message for isolating students will be left on the post board of the Class Team.
- A minimum expectation would be that resources for every timetabled lesson are on Teams in advance and students invited to seek clarification via email



If a staff member is in school but some students in the class are isolating - KS3 and KS4

- KS3 and KS4: Work will be set by the Class Teacher and placed in the Class Teams Area and on SMHW.
- A message for isolating students will be left on the post board of the Class Team to explain what type of lesson they are accessing e.g. joining for a live input or following instructions in a PowerPoint.
- A minimum expectation is that resources for every timetabled lesson are on Teams in advance with students invited to seek clarification via email



If a staff member is in but the whole class/year group are isolating - All Years

- Live lessons will be scheduled and delivered in the usual timetabled slot.
- Students can access lessons from their Subject Teams Pages
- Lessons will be recorded for students who cannot access the lesson at the time
- Whilst length of lesson may vary, start times will follow student timetables. Teachers will ensure that the students understand what they need to do before the live input ends.

If school closes to students for a short All Saints Catholic High School 'circuit break':



- Circuit breaks complete closure for students for a short period of time (no more than 2 weeks)
- Students will be asked to follow their usual timetable. A combination of live lessons and independent learning sessions will be scheduled and delivered. Lessons will be recorded for students who cannot access the lesson at the time
- Whilst length of lesson may vary, start times will follow the student timetable.
- Teachers & Subject Leaders will make sure students experience a variety of activities and tasks in each subject.



Accessibility

Learning Support

- The Learning Support team will be supporting pupils who are not in school with learning remotely in particular those with a SEND need
- The SENCo and SEND Manager will liaise with students and families to ensure they provide support for the right students in the most effective ways

Pupil Premium

- Student audits of remote learning access are regularly updated
- Loans of technology and equipment are available on request
- Paper versions of resources are also available
