They were able to explore the historical sites of Rome, including the Colosseum, the Spanish Steps, the Trevi Fountain, and the Pantheon. Students spent a great deal of time in the Vatican museums, Sistine Chapel, and St Peter's Basilica. Due to it being the Jubilee year, students were able to enter through the Holy Door in St Peter's – something that is only possible every 25 years. On the final day, they were invited to Mass at the English college where they offered prayers from All Saints staff and students in front of the reliquary, which was specially opened for All Saints. Students commented on the trip as being an ''unforgettable experience''.
