Rewards and Recognition at All Saints

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When a student's behaviour meets or goes above and beyond the expected behaviour standard, staff will recognise it with positive recognition and reward. Our approach to rewards and recognition follows a tiered approach with the opportunity for weekly resets and fresh starts for all students:

Tier 1 rewards

Tier 3 rewards

Always the All Saints Way award	Half termly certificate with increased rewards for accruing this each half term
Termly rewards events	Recognise student progress, participation, and achievement including no negatives – nominated by class teachers
